Please Note: Aboriginal Legal Services (ALS) will only consider preparing a Gladue Report for an Aboriginal person after the client has pled guilty or was found guilty after trial.

ALS normally write reports when crown position is 90 days or more. When crown position is less than 90 days, we will consider preparing a report on a case by case.

If ALS has not agreed in advance to prepare a Gladue Report, it cannot be held to produce the report on the date requested. ALS will endeavour to notify all parties as soon as possible, if it is not possible to complete the report for sentencing.

Only after ALS has received all of the information required, will the report get assigned to a Caseworker. We require at least seven weeks to complete a report.

For out of custody clients we require a contact phone number or email address.
